Instruments **sometimes** added to the orchestra:

Harp- ~~4~~7 strings, 7 pedals, belongs to the String family

Piano- 88 keys, 3 pedals, keyboard instrument with qualities of both the String and Percussion family.

Bass clarinet- Woodwind, lower than the regular clarinet

**Band instruments-** These were created too late to be part of the orchestra which is about 300 years old.

Saxophone- Woodwind instrument created about 130 years ago

Baritone- Brass instrument

Sousaphone- "Marching tuba" created by John Philip Sousa

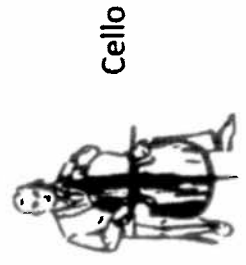


